


# Sunday, March 11, 2018: Fourth Sunday in Lent

## FR. JARETT'S CATHOLIC Q & A

### ***Do animals have souls and what does this mean about our relationship to them?***

How do we define the word soul? The Catechism speaks of soul only as, "the spiritual principle of human beings", thus it is not spoken of in reference to animals. However, the tradition of seeing all living things as possessing souls is not new and stems down to us through St. Thomas Aquinas, who was known for his study of Aristotelian philosophy. Aristotle described three types or levels of living things that contain souls. In this view, the soul is described as the "animating principle". When living things are disconnected from their "animating principle," they are no longer alive. Aristotle said the lowest level of soul is that of plants or vegetation. Secondly, he lists animals whose souls are above plants because of their enabling characteristic of locomotion, and lastly human beings who alone have rational reasoning souls. This seems to coincide with what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says on the topic of animal's relationship to humanity. Stating that there exists a hierarchy of value in creation as well as a difference between the souls of human beings, animals, and plants.



"God entrusted animals to the stewardship of those whom he created in his own image. Hence it is legitimate to use animals for food and clothing. They may be domesticated to help man in his work and leisure. Medical and scientific experimentation on animals is a morally acceptable practice if it remains within reasonable limits and contributes to caring for or saving human lives. It is contrary to human dignity to cause animals to suffer or die needlessly. It is likewise unworthy to spend money on them that should as a priority go to the relief of human misery. One can love animals; one should not direct to them the affection due only to persons. (CCC #2417-2418)

The bottom line is that in all ways the value of human beings must come before animals. This is spoken of in the first line of this Catechism passage is saying that humans are those "whom He created in His own image," which means that animals are not made in the image and likeness of God. They are certainly part of creation, and therefore good, but they are very different from human beings. Treatment of human beings should never to disproportionate to the treatment of animals. Is this the case?

We live in an interesting world. It seems that as the value for human life decreases from conception to natural death, the value for animal life increases. This can be seen to the point where married couples are holding off on the responsibilities of having children and substituting their place with multiple pets. Where more and more money is being spent on animal care in all stages of their lives and that they are being treated more as members of the family than some of the actual members of the family.

Now, don't get me wrong, I grew up always having pets around and for the first 18 years of my life, my greatest loss was our hunting dog that was hit by a car as my brother was out for a jog. The Catechism says we can love animals, and so we do. However, never should our love for animals be out of proportion in relation to our love for the poor, for the unborn, and for our own family.

Therefore to answer the question, yes, traditionally animals have been spoken of as possessing souls. However, it is different than the immortal rational soul of a human being. For this reason, we should have respect for animals as parts of God's creation, but we must have greater respect for humanity, created in the image and likeness of God.


