Humble Submission To The Father's will

Jesus gave us the ultimate example of what it means to be a man. Today, we see him humbling himself to the point that we are told: "though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God." He takes on our humanity and is "obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." I want us to go back now on part of what I left out. This is where the reading tells us that Christ's humble submission to the Father is "something to be grasped." I think this is my favorite part, because it is telling us to stop and really ponder what is happening.

Jesus, the Son of God, who is Divine Himself is lowering himself because of the will of the Father. Jesus did not have any tension with the Father, because His will was always the Father's will. If Jesus can submit to the Father, then this tells us that true submission to authority is not about a denying of inherent value, but is about having faith and living in accord with God, who is Truth Himself.

Submission to God doesn't always start with the really big things. It starts with our everyday acts of selflessness. This past Tuesday, I was blessed to attend the Father's Mass at HFE. What I saw were many dads who took off work, rescheduled appointments and suffered whatever inconveniences they had to so they could be there with their children. I watched as one dad came in a couple of minutes before Mass started, found his daughter and went to sit next to her. As she looked over, her eyes grew huge and she had the biggest smile on her face. When he sat down, she snuggled up next to him and laid her head on his arm. Every inconvenience was worth building his relationship with her. (This folks is what it looks like to be like Jesus. We have to be willing to say: "Whatever I have to do to be with my child on this special day, I am going to do it. I know it is going to cause some inconveniences, but my relationships with God and my family come first." Although these small inconveniences may not be on par with the suffering and death that Jesus went through for all of us, it is things like this that help us to grow in humble submission to the Father's will for the good of others. We have to get comfortable with being inconvenienced so that we may grow in virtue, and before long we will find ourselves loving the way Jesus loved.

"Father, I come before You seeking the grace to cultivate humility in my daily life.

Help me to serve others with a gentle heart.

May I find strength in surrender and wisdom in simplicity, reflecting Your love in all I do.

Guide me to walk humbly, embracing the beauty of selflessness.

Amen."

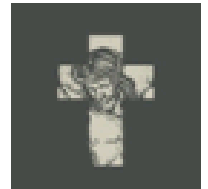

Everyone is encouraged to pray the novena to the Divine Mercy, which begins on Good Friday. Leaflets on this novena are in the brochure rack of the church. **CONFESSIONS WILL BE HEARD BEGINNING AT 2 p.m.** (PLEASE NOTE: Jesus told Saint Faustina that special graces are given to those who venerate the Divine Mercy Image, especially on Divine Mercy Sunday.) This prayer service is sponsored by Divine Mercy Radio.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

We begin this Holy Week with the reading of the Lord's Passion from the Gospel of Matthew. It is fitting that during this week we intensely focus our minds and hearts on the steps of our Savior as He laid down His very life for us. But let us also examine the seemingly small acts of stewardship by some who encountered Jesus during this most eventful week.

One occurred when Jesus gave instructions about the room where He would celebrate the Passover. Jesus said, "Go into the city to a certain man and tell him..." "In your house I shall celebrate the Passover with my disciples." While we do not know this man's name, we do know he agreed to this request — he shared the material gift of his home and the gift of hospitality. Because of his good stewardship, his own home became the site of the institution of the Eucharist!

There was also Simon the Cyrenian, who offered the gift of his physical strength, helping the Lord to carry His Cross. Consider, too, the actions of Joseph of Arimathea — he generously shared a material gift of the tomb that was his, and he gave the gift of service to our Lord by giving Him a proper burial. Then there were the "two Marys" who gave Jesus the gift of their time. Keeping watch in tender vigil after His death, they "remained sitting there, facing the tomb."

Each of these were simple acts of good stewardship, yet God used them in mighty ways. God invites each of us, too, to cooperate with Him in small ways through the sharing of our time, talent, and material gifts. Small gifts can become mighty deeds when placed in God's service.
