FR. JARETT'S CATHOLIC Q & A

What's the Catholic Churches teaching on Tattoos?

As I have stated before, I feel for parents, especially of teenage children, who have to sift through so much confusion and sometimes filth in order to raise respectful and well-rounded children. The list of challenging topics gets longer and longer. Can I get the newest Mafia video game; can I change my hair color, get my nose pierced, and finally get a tattoo? All of these things are obviously different, yet similar.

I list a wide variety of topics, and they have varying levels of seriousness, however, they are similar, in the sense that there is no official document or statement put out by the Catholic Church on the morality or immorality of these issues. In fact, you can find people on both sides of most of these topics. The truth is that they are becoming more popular and more common, especially among today's young adults.

So, let's look at both sides of the tattoo issue. Some argue that tattoos are amoral (neither immoral nor moral), that a tattoo is just another form of fashion and in some cases can even be a tool for evangelization. Some would say, in reference to religious tattoos, that they are an opportunity for people to know "to whom you belong." Some argue that it makes a person working for the faith more approachable by the younger generation, a way to draw young people into conversations about God and faith.

On the other side, those who would speak out about the immorality of tattoos will quote the book of Leviticus 19: 28, which states, "Do not lacerate your bodies for the dead, and do not tattoo yourselves. I am the LORD." (However, taken in context, then we also mustn't eat meat with blood in it, or trim our beards.) Others might quote the catechism, which speaks of the holiness of the body, created in God's image and likeness and that we must treat it as a temple of the Holy Spirit. These are valid points of reflection. What is the truth of the matter? Can we come to any formal conclusion on the morality or immorality of tattoos? Well, seemingly nothing concrete.

Thus, because the Catholic Church does not have an official statement/teaching on the topic, I feel the need to offer my own opinion. (Disclaimer: My Own Opinion: I can do this cause I have a column.) Young people and old as well, are looking to pave a new path, find their identity, and to be their own individual. What motivates this quest? There can be pure motives, but if we are honest with ourselves as human beings, to some degree there can exist underneath a level of pride and/or vanity. We want to be an individual, because individuals are "free" and they get noticed, recognized, praised, etc.

People speak of tattoos as being a personal choice for oneself. Has anyone ever gotten a tattoo that will never be seen by another human being? The motivation of a tattoo is to show it off, is it not? Maybe not everyone will see, but we often have some audience in mind when thinking about a tattoo. We love the hype, we love the attention, and we love the affiliation that comes with those who have tattoos. "Oh you have one, let me show you mine." Is this evil in and of itself?

Are children evil when they yell on the playground, "Hey Mommy, look what I can do?" or "Watch me, Look, Look, Look!?" Not evil, perhaps a little self-centered. Ingrained in each of us is this desire to be noticed, and I personally, would place tattoos in that category. A little more serious than ear piercing or hair coloring, by way of their permanence. (Personally, I change my computer screen saver every other month; I can't imagine trusting my judgment on a lifetime piece of body art.) Also, in excess they can cover the beauty of God's creation, as though we are dissatisfied with the beauty of our own body. "You wouldn't permanently paint over Leonardo Da Vinci's Last Supper would you, and God is the divine artist."

So am I a tattooed person hater? No. It's not something I would choose for myself, or counsel someone toward, but I don't cast judgment upon those who have them, because the Church doesn't. As soon as the Catholic Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, states that tattoos are completely acceptable or are sinful, then there is my new position. There's actually much freedom in not having to build one's own morality on each new topic that comes our way.


