## FR. JARETT'S CATHOLIC Q & A

*My husband is not Catholic, even though I do continue to encourage him to consider the possibility of becoming Catholic. However, if he were to die before becoming Catholic would it be possible for him to be buried in a Catholic cemetery near the rest of our family?*

According to the *Directory for the Application of Principles and Norms on Ecumenism*,

“Catholic churches are consecrated or blessed buildings which have an important theological and liturgical significance for the Catholic community. They are therefore generally reserved for Catholic worship. However, if priests, ministers or communities not in full communion with the Catholic Church do not have a place or the liturgical objects necessary for celebrating worthily their religious

ceremonies, the diocesan Bishop may allow them the use of a church or a Catholic building and also lend them what may be necessary for their services. Under similar circumstances, permission may be given to them for interment or for the celebration of services at Catholic cemeteries.” (137) Therefore, if the Diocesan bishop grants permission, it is acceptable for the non-Catholic spouse of a Catholic to be buried in a Catholic cemetery. Normally, that permission is granted on a general basis for all within a diocese.

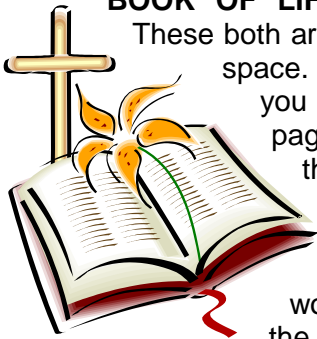

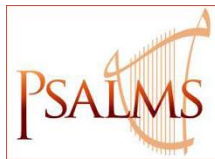

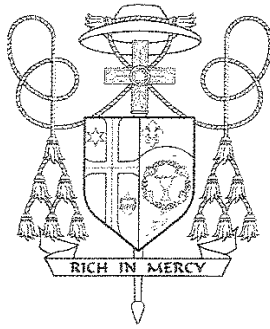
