FR. JARETT'S CATHOLIC Q & A

A Reflection for October; A Respect Life Month

I consider myself a stereotypical “guy” when it comes to movie genres. One area of film and documentary that I usually find interesting is the subject of war. The conflict, the sadness, the strategy, the sacrifice and sometimes even the horror of war; makes this genre of filmmaking interesting to me. Of course, I am not making any statements about any particular wars nor am I in favor of war; in general, I just find the stories interesting. One of my favorite motion pictures in this genre is a miniseries released a few years ago that was directed and produced by Tom Hanks and Steven Spielberg called *Band of Brothers*. In this mini-series there is one episode titled “Why We Fight” that documents the discovery of the Nazi concentration (death) camps in Germany and parts of Poland during WWII. The episode begins with the American forces sending a scout troop around a newly conquered German city discovering that just outside the boundary of the town exists one such concentration camp. It takes the American soldiers some time to find out why the camp was built and what was going on there. Consequently, when they discover that the site was a death camp for Jews and other religious and cultural figures they become angered and return to the German city to take their anger out on the citizens who allowed such atrocities to happen in their own back yard.

The first time I saw this episode I remember being drawn into the emotion of it all and at one point even getting upset at all the German towns and citizens that stood by to do nothing while their own military tortured and killed millions of innocent people. How could a human being stand by and live a normal life when such injustice was occurring so close by. You would at least think they would voice some form of disapproval. Then it struck me. How many innocent human beings have been destroyed in my own country, in my own state, allowed by my own government and what have I done in protest? Am I any different than the Germans who stood by and watched innocent human beings die and yet remained silent?

It seems fairly obvious to so many people in our nation that abortion is the destruction of innocent human life. Yet, so often as Americans if it doesn't directly affect me then it's none of my business. Sometimes we justify our idleness in this cause as we describe so many injustices that are taking place inside and outside our nation's borders... children are starving, and people are homeless. However, none of these injustices, no matter how severe measures up to the injustice that human beings are being created and then destroyed as a choice of convenience. Is it a life? Is that even an argument anymore? With ultra sounds and 3D imaging within the womb can we seriously argue that it's not a living human being? If a child comes out of the womb accidentally three months early, our advanced medicine can keep the child alive and healthy. However, if a child is forced out of the womb surgically and killed three months early, it's a legal medical procedure. Obviously, most of us have heard all sides of the issue, we all know the pain involved for mothers on both sides, however there is objective truth here that human beings are being killed and we are called to speak out against injustice. How do we do it?

Most of us in Hays and throughout the Salina Diocese are too far from an abortion clinic to attend the prayer groups that meet every week as silent protest. There are the protests of the Pro-life Marches in Topeka and in Washington D.C. in January. Perhaps most importantly there is prayer. This intention should be part of our daily prayer. Prayer for an end to abortion; prayer for those wounded by abortion; prayer for those performing abortions; prayer for those supporting abortion; and prayer for ourselves to know where God is calling us to be His voice for those who have no voice.


